

But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

MISSIONARIES OF CHRIST

If I ever travel overseas and don't know anyone at the place to which I am going, I search the internet for accommodation. There are many apps to assist. Experiencing a welcome and a sense of hospitality when I finally arrive is such a gift.

Luke's Gospel addressees are missionaries. They are moving around the Greco-Roman world, probably around Asia Minor (today's Turkey), committed to preaching about Jesus. They would be relying on local hospitality. Today's Gospel plugs right into this situation and Jesus offers Luke's missionaries wisdom: Go with a colleague, don't be alone, there will be times when they will experience hardship even rejection and feel like 'lambs among wolves', travel lightly as their mission for the Kingdom is urgent, offer peace to households that are hospitable, receive what is offered from them, and stay present to those who are open, don't become itinerant, moving 'from house to house' and offer God's gift of healing.

While Jesus speaks this wisdom to Luke's missionary audience of the late first century CE, it applies equally to us in our faith communities and parishes today seeking to discern our futures with a synodal spirit. Today's Gospel invites us to be concerned about those around us. We, too, are called to announce: 'The kingdom of God is very near to you'!

Clearly most of the problem lies with a perpetrator. But ... something more happened, it would seem to me from afar that the safeguarding culture of the site failed – somehow.

It is that culture of safeguarding which we are putting such a big effort into in Doncaster and Templestowe Parishes. I know it can seem as though we are just doing paperwork with checks and codes of conduct and training but surrounding those legal necessities is our culture.

I try to make clear and hope I succeed in making it clear that it is you and I, all of us, being sensibly aware of children and the situations surrounding them. You and I seek to ensure situations don't arise where children are alone with one adult or otherwise unsafe.

Thank you for all the efforts you are putting in – thank you to the Safeguarding team across Doncaster and Templestowe (David, Ana, Gianna, Margaret, Marcello, Gabee, Natalie, Paul).

Congratulations on the progress we have made in compliance but even more so in our culture. I now have people who come to me or to Ana or to David and comment on things that could be improved with how we prepare for and execute events. Thank you.

Peter's Pence: My apologies. Last weekend I said that the Peter's Pence collection goes entirely to charitable needs funded by the pope. I now find that in fact the funds are also used to help the works of the various departments (dicasteries) of the Vatican – the groups which help the Pope lead the Roman Catholic Church. The money still all goes to spreading the Good News.


